The Environment Office of the Saugeen Ojibway Nation (SON) is seeking two motivated Community Members for a 24-week contract to act as Borehole Drilling Monitors at NWMO's borehole drilling sites near Teeswater, ON.

The Environment Office is seeking two motivated SON Community Members who are interested in learning more about the Nuclear Waste Management Organization's (NWMO) proposed deep geologic repository for high-level waste, acting as ambassadors for SON, and sharing information with other SON Community Members.

NWMO is beginning a six month borehole drilling process near Teeswater, ON on April 1, 2021. We are looking for motivated and interested Community Members who would like to participate in this process through daily monitoring of the borehole drilling activities and sharing of information with the SON Communities, the Environment Office and Joint Council.

These positions will ensure that:

- Any unintended environmental or archaeological impacts that occur at the site are reported on and actions taken to resolve.
- SON Community members are updated throughout the borehole drilling process.
- The Environment Office and Joint Council are updated throughout the borehole drilling process, and informed if any unexpected events occur.

- Interest in geology, ecology, or archaeology.
